Subject: Guardians of the Range & Old Timer's seek entries for Cowboy Parade on National Day of the American Cowboy & Old Timer's Day

**Hyattville, Wyoming** – The Guardians of the Range and Hyattville Old Timer's Committee are seeking cowboys, cowgirls, ranchers, old timers and others to enter the Cowboy Parade on Saturday, July 25<sup>th</sup>, in Hyattville for the National Day of the American Cowboy (NDAC) and 100<sup>th</sup> Annual Hyattville Old Timer's Day celebration.

Individuals, groups, and businesses with horse-drawn wagons, buggies, and chuck wagons, as well as riders on horseback are encouraged to enter. Automobile and float entries are also accepted.

Parade line up is at 3:30 p.m. south of Hyattville near the racetrack, and the parade begins at 4pm. The parade route is approximately one mile long. Entries are free, and pre-registration is encouraged by July 18. The parade theme is cowboy and cowgirl heritage. The Cowboy Parade is part of a fantastic lineup of events beginning with the Old Timer's Picnic at noon in the Group Shelter at the Medicine Lodge State Archaeological Site. The family fun continues at 2pm in downtown Hyattville with a street fair and farmer's market, critter rides, kids games and events, silent auction, log branding, raffles for a Henry "Golden Boy" .22 rifle and up to \$500 in gift certificates, as well as live entertainment. Evening events include a worn-out cowboy boot contest, awards ceremony, and street dance with music by the Cowley Boys.

The Guardians of the Range are hosting the NDAC celebration in conjunction with the 100<sup>th</sup> Annual Old Timer's Celebration. The Ten Sleep – Hyattville Lion's Club is also sponsoring the festivities.

The Guardians are a non-profit organization dedicated to sound science and community partnership in public land management. They address grazing issues on behalf of permittees on the Shoshone and Bighorn National Forests, the Cody and Worland BLM Resource Management areas, and their surrounding communities.
